





This week, Year 1 and Year 2 children have been exploring illustrations from our new focus text. The children have made inferences about a character from the story. In mathematics, the Year 2 children have been focusing on repeated addition to solve multiplication problem, whilst Year 1 have been focusing systematically recording number bonds to ten and twenty. Year 3 have launched their new IPC topic -Land, Sea and Sky. The artwork they have completed is wonderful, and is proudly on display in their classroom. In mathematics they continue to work on their multiplication and division facts for x8 tables. Year 4 have enjoyed launching their new IPC Topic- Land, Sea and Sky. The students have also this week made great progress in their understanding of adding and subtracting fractions. They have also started their new class novel, The Wild Robot by Peter Brown. Year 5 have enjoyed learning about fractions and their decimal equivalents. The students have been making connections between their learning on fractions and applying it to decimals. The class has made some excellent progress in their mathematics learning and are really trying hard with their subject specific vocabulary. They even played some games in a maths lesson! In IPC, the Year 6 students have begun 'They see the world like this' focusing on art from different cultures and historical periods around the world. The children are very excited about this topic! .
